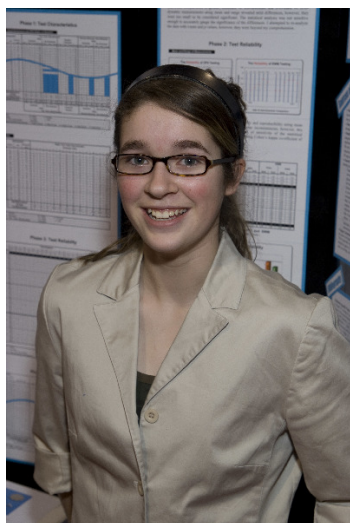

What's the Point?

Abstract: Clinical tests to measure touch sensitivity are an important means of identifying nerve injury and monitoring recovery. My project investigated the characteristics and reliability of two tests commonly used by healthcare professionals to assess touch sensitivity: two-point discrimination and Semmes-Weinstein monofilaments. The study clearly demonstrates that these tests results cannot be considered clinically significant unless they increase or decrease by a minimum of two increments.
