Sommaire: This study evaluated the effects of caffeine on crickets. Crickets were fed two concentrations of caffeine solution and then given a choice of water or caffeine solution. Mass, length and reactivity were also measured before and after exposure. Caffeine fed crickets preferred a caffeine solution over water. This experiment shows that crickets experience many similar changes in body function and behavior as humans do.
