Impact of Microwaves on Plant Growth

Abstract: The purpose of our project was to determine if microwaves affect the germination and growth of plants. Our controls were treated with boiled water while all other plants were treated with microwaved water. Results during this experiment showed no significant growth differences in plants treated with microwaved or boiled water. We have concluded that microwaved water does not significantly affect plant germination or growth.
