Abstract: This study explored whether teenage girl's perceptions about their health and body image were impacted by the current focus on obesity. Body mass index (BMI) scores and subjective ratings of health perceptions and behaviors on a self-administered survey were gathered from 49 subjects. Findings from chi square analyses indicate that perceptions of teenage girls, particularly those with a higher BMI, are negatively impacted.
