Abstract: Does a corked bat make a baseball have greater average speed than a regular wood bat? The project hypothesis says that if cork is added to a hollowed out wood bat, then it will generate more ball speed than an unmodified wood bat. Based on the results of the experiment, the hypothesis was accepted. Corked bats generate greater average ball speed.
