

Does Nagging Help?

Abstract: Will repeating something more than once help the listener remember better

over time? Thirty-five participants were asked to recall words immediately, and after a 5-minute activity, from a list of 15 words which were read once and then twice on a second occasion. A statistical difference was found in the number of words remembered after 5 minutes when the words were


read twice versus once.
