Abstract: Focusing on questions of authority, and its effects on ethical decision-making, this project builds on the work of Stanley Milgram, extending his research with a unique approach to understanding ethical decision-making. The project compares the two types of authority that affect ethical decision-making: authority held by oneself, and external authority. My results are intriguing, revealing new insights into the impact of age on decision-making.
