How Does Your Garden Grow?

Abstract: This project studied the practices of over 100 vegetable gardeners in the Municipality of West Grey, Ontario. An in-depth survey of each gardener was completed. A total of 960 soil core samples were collected from their gardens. Soil analyses indicated that nutrient content was excessive. The project identified several factors, such as location, that if not managed properly, could have a negative environmental impact.
