Abstract: The objective of my project is to determine whether or not a Suspension

Bridge is stronger than a Warren Truss Bridge. I observed how these two bridge designs respond to live load by measuring the vertical displacement of each bridge's roadbed when the same amount of weight was applied.

After conducting 42 trials, my hypothesis was accepted.

Biography

A disciplined piano student, he has performed in benefit concerts in support of early childhood education, among other charities. He plays alto-saxophone in SHS Jazz Band and performs with the Montreal Jazzkidz Orchestra.
