Can Your Diet Prevent Alzheimer's? The effects of Lysine on APP **Processing**

Challenge: Health Category: Senior

Abstract: For my project, I tested the effects of the amino acid lysine on the

processing of Amyloid-Beta plaques that are known contributors to Alzheimer's Disease. I found that the neuron samples with Lysine applied released less of the Beta peptides, therefore they are less likely to form plaques, suggesting that increasing the nutritional load of lysine could act

as a preventative measure for Alzheimer's disease.
