Abstract: Our work "Optical Illusions - Does Colour Affect The Illusion?" studies

optical illusions, specifically colour modifications. The first thing tested was whether vision level affects susceptibility to illusions. We found that they are not correlated using the chi-squared test of independence. The second thing tested, our main focus, was whether colour modifications that maintain relation on the color wheel are equivalent in the illusion's effectiveness.
