Abstract: As technology and society continue to change and improve there has been a marked increase in the amount of sound and noise. However, do we always want to hear the constant noise of technology? This experiment seeks to minimize noise with sound-absorption. Discover which of cork, carpet, carpet underlay, curtains, bubble wrap, or polystyrene foam (Styrofoam) has the best capabilities to provide quiet.
