

The Algal Alternative: A Biofuel Investigation

Abstract: Microalgae provide a very costly source of biofuel; this experiment explored

how the synthesis of fatty acids by Chlorella vulgaris were affected under nitrogen-deprived growth conditions. Chlorella vulgaris strains were

cultivated and exposed to six different nitrogen-concentrations. Cell extracts

and media filtrates were subjected to TLC, testing for fatty acids. Concluding, increasing concentrations of nitrogen produced greater

varieties of fatty acids within Chlorella vulgaris.

Biography

I am a graduating grade 12 student from the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme at Korah Collegiate in Sault Ste Marie, Ontario. I am an avid environmentalist, and and president of my school's environmental club, Green Council. I am extremely intrigued by the interactions between living cells and molecules, and so I hope to pursue biochemical research.
