Abstract: My project is to prevent erosion on steep slopes due to bug kill and fires. I planted 3 kinds of grass seed (2 native, 1 domesticated) on 10 plots on a 64 degree angle slope. Half of the plots were mulched and half were left without mulch. Stakes with a ruler pattern drawn on them were driven into each plot to measure the erosion.
