Abstract: Horses are the animal kingdom's most highly developed athletes. With such high performance, however, comes high risk - the hoof must withstand accelerations of up to 2000 meters/second, leaving horses liable to the skeletal fractures that account for 89% of casualties. Using a combination of evolutionary biology and material engineering, this project aims to improve the horseshoe and increase the safety of equine sport.

Neria Aylward is a grade 11 student at Holy Heart High School in St. John's, Newfoundland. An alumnus of the Shad Valley program, she attended the campus at Université Laval in 2012.
