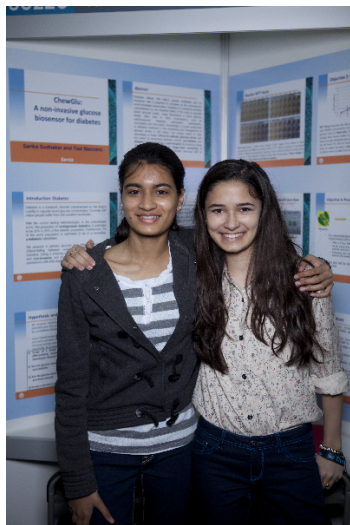

Abstract: Diabetes affects 246 million people worldwide and its incidence rate is projected to increase. Early diagnosis and management of pre-diabetics and diabetics is of paramount importance to our health care system. We developed a non-invasive glucose biosensor capable of discerning between normal, pre-diabetic and diabetic subjects that can be implemented for large-scale screening of populations at low cost, with minimal technical skill to administer.
