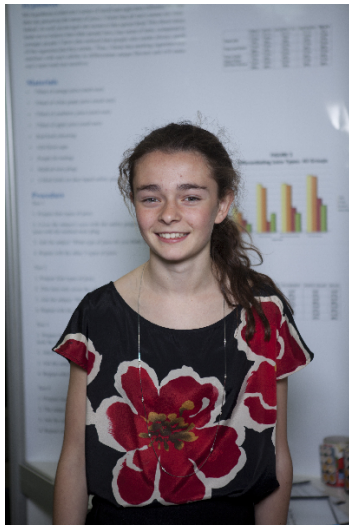

The Nose Knows

Challenge: Health

Abstract: This experiment shows that one's sense of taste is influenced by one's sense of smell and sight. As additional senses are added to taste, one improves by 19-22% in ability to recognize four different juice types. Overall, youths were better than smokers and people over 55 years of age in recognizing juice types.
