Abstract: My theory is that alpaca manure tea repels deer without harming the environment. I made a manure tea and conducted three experiments: testing the manure teas' pH for adverse effects; growing pole beans using manure teas, and determining if deer would cross an alpaca manure and tea barrier. My results to date indicate alpaca manure tea repels deer, helps germination, and doesn't harm plant life.
