What Colour Was That?

Challenge: Health

Abstract: In this experiment, the colour of text was changed to determine how colour affects memory. Students attempted to memorize coloured numbers that were projected on a screen. After 80 tests, it was found that changing the text colour had almost no affect on a person's memorization. The experiment was repeated with a constant colour but different font sizes.
