Sommaire: Health and economic costs of annual influenza are enormous; pandemics

potentially catastrophic. Vaccination is an important defense, but some groups have created "vaccine anxiety" without scientific basis, or sometimes using fake data. To clarify, I collected results from 12 large clinical trials, and found flu infection rates were reduced 50%-80% without any evidence of serious side effects among thousands of people who

received flu vaccine.
