Monitoring Medication Adherence-Part 2

Abstract: Medication mismanagement can be avoided if adherence is monitored.

Photos of blister-packed medications, taken by an automatic camera at timed intervals as they are being used, can monitor adherence. This technology can be used to test whether standard cognitive tests can predict

the risk of medication mismanagement. Also, photos uploaded to the internet in real time can alert caregivers immediately when dosing errors

occur.
