Don't Get Burned: An Analysis of Sunscreen

Abstract: It is important to apply sunscreen to protect our skin from damage and increased risk of skin cancer. The experiments I did compared new and expired sunscreens of the same brand and sun protection factor (SPF) to see how well they blocked ultraviolet (UV) light, and compared how much UV light was blocked by different brands of new sunscreen with the same SPF.
