Thinking about thinking: instinctive versus non-instinctive methods in archery

Abstract: In the field of psychology there is a distinction made between conscious

and unconscious decision making. Similarly, in archery there are two methods of shooting; instinctive (unconscious) and non-instinctive (conscious). In this project I tested recreational archers to determine whether an instinctive or non-instinctive method of shooting produces higher scores. There was a non-significant trend toward higher scores with

non-instinctive shooting.
