The Attraction of Distractions

Abstract: The Attraction of Distractions, set in a high school setting, explores the

effects distractions have on productivity. This experiment compares the amount of time students take to type while under different distractions, such as cafeteria noise, background music, and conversation. The deviation between control and distractions revealed some unpredictable results which may explain the productivity levels while working in different environments.
