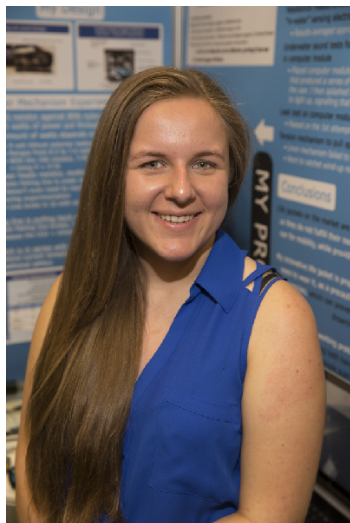

Abstract: Medical emergencies, often sudden and incapacitating, may explain a large portion of mysterious drownings among competent swimmers. My product fills a void for those who do not wish to wear a traditional life jacket, by giving them the best chance of survival. It automatically detects incapacitating situations, ensures timely rescues by bringing victims to the surface, and helps alert bystanders to respond to the scene.
