

Aging in Human Cells is Linked to BubR1 Expression

Abstract: In 2004, scientists showed how levels of BubR1, a mitotic checkpoint

protein affects the aging phenotype in mice. I am investigating if there is a correlation between low BubR1 expression and the aging phenotype in humans using normal human cell lines and progeria cell lines. Analyzing protein harvested from the cells through time, I was able to find this

correlation with BubR1 in humans.
