Abstract: The main focus of my project is HIV/AIDS knowledge, attitude and behavior. The methodology used was a knowledge, attitude and behavior survey. The target population was youth 12-18 years and adults 19 years and older. In the knowledge section of the survey, adult females scored the highest. In the attitude and behavior sections, both age groups had very similar responses.
