On the Pathway to Healing: Risk Factors of Alcoholism in Fort Resolution, NT

Challenge: Discovery

Abstract: Over the past thirty years, the rate alcoholism in Fort Resolution has

decreased from 50% to 33%. This study aimed to identify risk factors of severe alcoholism in Fort Resolution to circumvent future alcoholism and aid those already trying to recover. The age group (18-31) was significantly associated, while childhood economic insecurity and parental alcoholism

were strongly, yet not significantly associated with alcoholism.

Laney - My name is Laney Beaulieu and I am a grade 11 student who attends Deninu School. Deninu is stationed in Fort Resolution, NWT and has a population of roughly 500 people.
