What Should I Wear (to the Battle)?

Abstract: This experiment tested the effectiveness of three pre-modern armours:

linothorax (layered linen), cuir bouilli (boiled leather), and padded chainmail, placed on Styrofoam with a rubbery coating to simulate skin and flesh, against three common pre-modern weapons: a stone (blunt trauma), an axe (blade), and an arrow (piercing). All offered significant protection against blunt trauma and blade, but linothorax offered superior protection against

the arrow.
