Effects of Faba Bean Ingredients on Glycemia and Satiety in Novel Food Products

Abstract: A clinical trial was conducted to investigate the effects of consuming

smoothies made with different faba bean ingredients on glycemic control and satiety. Twenty-six healthy males were recruited, and each was subject to five different treatment smoothies in a randomized order. The results suggest that the faba bean protein concentrate and protein isolate ingredients have the best overall effect on glycemic control and satiety.
