Investigating the Short Term Influence of Caffeine on Brain Function

Abstract: We tested 48 people, which were separated into a decaf, control and a group that ingested 100 mg of caffeine. Subjects were then given a cognitive ability and reaction time test. We discovered that between groups there was a minimal difference in test score, and found that caffeine has minimal effect on test score, and a larger but still insignificant effect on reaction score.
