Abstract: Conserving the endangered leatherback sea turtle (Dermochelys coriacea)

requires understanding the way its behaviour may put it at risk for entanglement in fishing gear, one of the primary threats to its survival. To this end, I investigated the behaviour of leatherbacks found in three bays late in the foraging season. I wanted to understand if their behaviour

differed between bays with northern and southern mouths.
