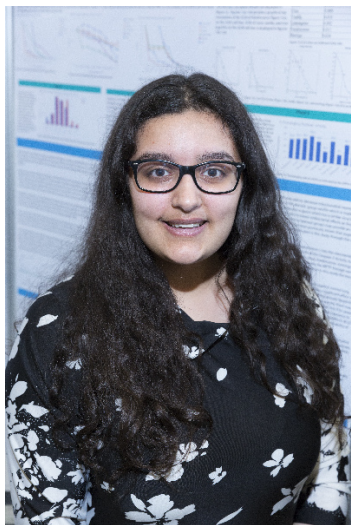

Essential Oils: A Smelly Cancer Treatment

Abstract: This project investigated the potential for selected essential oils (EOs) to induce cell death in colorectal, lung, and brain cancer cell lines. Cytotoxicity of the EOs in non-cancerous cell lines was also determined. The EOs demonstrated anticancer effects but did not significantly affect the viability of non-cancerous cells. Mechanisms employed by the EOs in order to induce cell death were also determined.

Biography
