Abstract: Overactivity of the carotid body increases blood pressure. The study

A Novel Chemogenetic Approach to Treat Drug Resistant

showed that, overactive carotid body containing DREADD (a genetically engineered designer receptor microinjected into the carotid body) when treated with CNO (a designer drug which exclusively binds with the receptor) decreased blood pressure in hypertensive rat. This is a novel chemogenetic approach, with minimum side effects, to treat hypertension

without surgically removing the carotid body.
