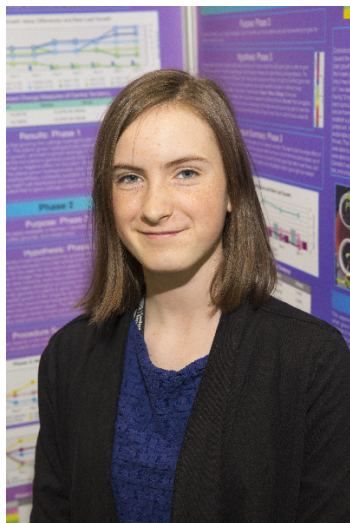

Abstract: This experiment investigated ways to grow a medicinal plant to fight diabetes in Northern Canada to address the incredibly high rates of diabetes, and provide a fresh vegetable grown inside the home. This project discovered that an Asian plant, *Gynura Procumbens*, fertilized with eggshell tea, thrives in the short daylight hours of Northern Canada, cost efficiently and conveniently, to effectively promote health in northern communities.

Biography

I am Emma Palmer, a grade 8 student at Pretty River Academy, and this is my second time attending CWSF. Every year since grade 4, I have had the pleasure of attending the Simcoe County Regional Science Fair and it is always my favourite time of year.
