Taking Flight: Monarch Butterfly Conservation

Abstract: As someone who has experience with rearing monarch butterflies, I have developed an understanding of their endangered status. There are existing sanctuary designs but they have not been proven to increase the population. This project, a new user-friendly sanctuary design, mimics the monarch larvae habitat with the goal that it will be used by people to rear monarchs and help restore the population.
