

Abstract: In Canada, about 40% of all home insurance claims result from water

damage, the number one kind of loss for home insurance claims. With this in mind, I wanted to replace the commonly used gypsum drywall with bioplastic walls which have a low water absorbency rate, a high decay rate,

the ability to withstand a given force, and anti-flammable properties.
