Is my Yukon tap water safe to drink?

Abstract: Considering the present concern for safe drinking water, this project studied the quality of tap water in Whitehorse, Yukon. Re-creating the process used in the city's water testing lab, water samples from home and school were filtered and incubated, then tested for traces of total coliforms or E.coli. It was found that the water was safe to drink, showing no bacterial growth.
