Does Microwaving Water Affect Plant Growth?

Abstract: Seven water treatments were compared to determine whether the growth of barley would be effected when watered with microwaved, boiled and tap water. After growing the barley for three weeks the plant heights were compared using an analysis of variance. The results showed that at a 95% and 99% level of confidence there was no significant difference between the seven water treatments.
