Abstract: This project studied the relationship between taste sensitivity for sweetness,

sourness, and saltiness (dominant flavours in junk food) and Body Mass Index (BMI) percentile in a sample of 12 year old boys in a Toronto school. Boys with high BMI (? 85th percentile) reported low sensitivity to sweet, salty, and sour flavours. Boys with low BMI (? 45th percentile) reported high

sensitivity to these flavours.
