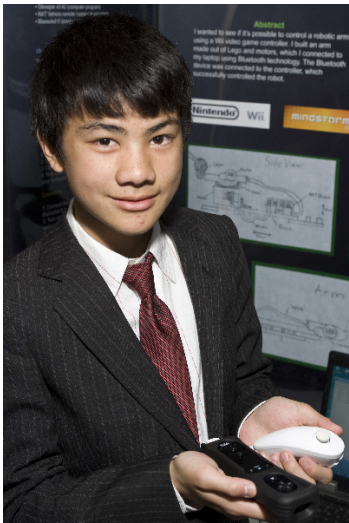


# CWSF 2010 - Peterborough, Ontario
