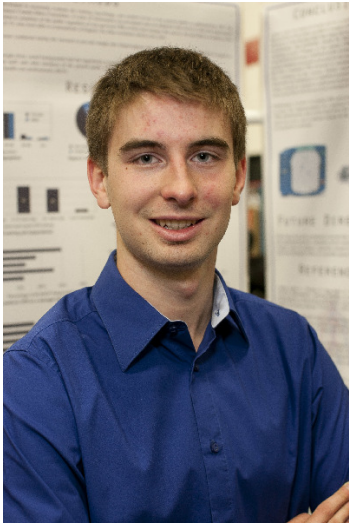

Surviving Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrest

Abstract: The incident rate of bystander CPR during a cardiac arrest is known to be low, potentially contributing to deaths. This study shows that many people trained in CPR have low confidence and misconceptions that may cause hesitation to perform CPR. This suggests that public education is needed to improve the confidence and ability of members of the public to manage a cardiac arrest effectively.
